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## 1. Qualitative Information on Quarterly Financial Results

### (1) Overview of Quarterly Operating Results for the Period under Review

Looking back on the economic environment during the period under review (the first quarter from January 1, 2026 to March 31, 2026), in the United States, although personal consumption remains somewhat weak due to deterioration of the labor market and acceleration of inflation, business sentiment has improved, and the economy is resilient, particularly in the artificial intelligence-related sectors. In Europe, against the backdrop of a favorable employment environment and stable prices, personal consumption has held up well, and the economy is on a gradual recovery track. In Asia, while there are signs of recovery in service consumption and fixed asset investment in China, the economy remains soft due to the lingering sluggishness of the real estate market. In other Asian countries, the economy is on a moderate recovery trend, underpinned by the resilience of domestic demand, including personal consumption. In Japan, although there are concerns about the economic outlook due to the risk of a surge in energy prices, the economy is gradually recovering as domestic demand, including personal consumption and capital investment, has remained solid. In the electronics market to which the Group relates, onshoring of capital investment in memory and other semiconductors is progressing amid robust demand for artificial intelligence in the United States. In Europe, intra-regional supply chains are being strengthened through investment in environmental initiatives and power semiconductors. In addition, in China, investment in leading-edge processes is restricted by export controls by the United States and other factors while intensifying competition is putting downward pressure on prices. Meanwhile, in ASEAN, its role as an EMS/ODM production base is being reinforced, and capital investment is robust, primarily in automation. The Group recognizes that demand is expected to grow over the medium to long term, supported by the electrification of automobiles and industrial equipment driven by technological innovations such as CASE and IoT, as well as efforts to address climate change, and will work to expand transactions with major global companies, both Japanese and non-Japanese.

Consolidated net sales for the period under review increased by 1,454 million yen (2.0%) year on year to 74,036 million yen. On the profit front, the Company posted an operating profit of 2,687 million yen, a decrease of 154 million yen (5.4%) year on year. Ordinary profit was 3,163 million yen, an increase of 483 million yen (18.1%) year on year. Profit attributable to owners of parent was 2,243 million yen, an increase of 378 million yen (20.3%) year on year.

The analysis of performance for the period under review is described in the performances and contributing factors of each business segment.

Performances and contributing factors of each business segment are as follows. Since the period under review, as a result of a revision to the management classification, SIIX Electronics Co., Ltd., which had previously been part of the “company-wide (common)” and included in “adjustment,” has been included and presented in the “Japan” segment. Accordingly, the year-on-year comparison and analysis are based on the classification after the change. “Segment profit (loss)” is based on operating profit in the consolidated statement of income. In addition, “net sales” includes inter-segment internal net sales or transfers.

(Japan)

Net sales in this segment were 25,269 million yen, an increase of 2,835 million yen (12.6%) year on year, mainly due to an increase in shipment of components for industrial equipment.

Segment profit was 421 million yen, an increase of 216 million yen (105.7%) year on year, mainly due to an increase in net sales.

(Greater China)

Net sales in this segment were 18,019 million yen, a decrease of 514 million yen (2.8%) year on year, mainly due to a decrease in shipment of components for information equipment and home appliances.

Segment profit was 18 million yen, a decrease of 271 million yen (93.7%) year on year, mainly due to a

decrease in net sales.

(ASEAN)

Net sales in this segment were 27,943 million yen, a decrease of 343 million yen (1.2%) year on year, mainly due to a decrease in shipment of components for home appliances and information equipment.

Segment profit was 1,138 million yen, a decrease of 62 million yen (5.2%) year on year, mainly due to a decrease in net sales.

(Europe)

Net sales in this segment were 5,506 million yen, a decrease of 946 million yen (14.7%) year on year, mainly due to a decrease in shipment of components for automotive-related equipment.

This segment recorded a segment profit of 109 million yen mainly due to reductions in manufacturing costs. (a segment loss of 195 million yen in the same period of the previous fiscal year).

(Americas)

Net sales in this segment were 21,463 million yen, an increase of 2,977 million yen (16.1%) year on year, mainly due to an increase in shipment of components for industrial equipment.

Segment profit was 1,141 million yen, a decrease of 178 million yen (13.5%) year on year, mainly due to an increase in packing and freight costs.

## (2) Overview of Financial Position for the Period under Review

(Assets)

Total assets increased by 1,523 million yen (0.7%) from the end of the previous fiscal year to 209,385 million yen.

Current assets were 155,389 million yen mainly due to increases of 1,855 million yen (3.2%) in notes and accounts receivable - trade, and contract assets and 847 million yen (2.8%) in cash and deposits.

Non-current assets were 53,995 million yen, a decrease of 1,114 million yen (2.0%) from the end of the previous fiscal year.

(Liabilities)

Total liabilities decreased by 1,172 million yen (1.1%) from the end of the previous fiscal year to 102,905 million yen.

Current liabilities were 71,283 million yen, a decrease of 322 million yen (0.5%) from the end of the previous fiscal year. This was mainly due to an increase of 2,189 million yen (5.4%) in accounts payable - trade and a decrease of 2,474 million yen (16.9%) in short-term borrowings.

Non-current liabilities were 31,621 million yen, a decrease of 849 million yen (2.6%) from the end of the previous fiscal year. This was mainly due to a decrease of 705 million yen (7.0%) in long-term borrowings.

(Net assets)

Net assets were 106,480 million yen, an increase of 2,695 million yen (2.6%) from the end of the previous fiscal year. This was mainly due to an increase of 1,550 million yen (4.7%) in foreign currency translation adjustment associated with exchange rate fluctuations.

As a result, the capital-to-asset ratio increased from 49.7% to 50.6%.
